This requires an understanding of legal principles and litigation tactics applicable to eDiscovery, as well as knowledge of the IT systems used to store ESI. The JANUS eDiscovery CLE program, which explores the mechanical processes of eDiscovery from a litigator’s perspective, is designed to provide attorneys with the practical information needed to comply with evolving legal rules and industry standards.”
